Free Vision Screening Monday March 11th & Tuesday March 12th

On the dates shown above the Carmel Lions Club will offer *free vision screenings* for all children from 18 months to 6 years of age.

Attached is an Operation KidSight Consent Form. <u>This form must be completed and signed in order for your child to be screened</u>. Below is information that may help you in deciding whether to have your child's eyes screened.
