
The Muppets

Questions: What lessons can we learn from the things that Scrooge experienced? Is it ever too late to change your mind about how you live your life? Why or why not? If you were to choose one thing that you would change about your life, what would it be? Did Scrooge learn his lesson and how did he see the error of his ways? What did he miss out on by only caring about work and money instead of friends or family? How do you show the people in your life that you love them? Are you generous? How? We celebrate Christmas because God sent Jesus into the world to show us our need to change our lives and to follow the example of His life. Parent Info: Scrooge learns to think of others before himself. By the end, he starts to worry about Tiny Tim's health and ends up buying the prize turkey for the Cratchit family. Scrooge also learns to be the best and nicest he can while his life lasts. He learns that it is never too late to change. This movie teaches us that just because your past (or present) wasn't (or isn't) so good, you don't have to be rude to others. The Ghost of Christmas Future is scarier than the others and may frighten more sensitive children. In one version of the future, Tiny Tim is projected to die. Scrooge has to confront his cruel behavior and learns life lessons because of it. Recommended age 6 and up.
