A beautiful Christmas story. A captivating fantasy. From the very heart of renowned Christian apologetic C.S. Lewis is the story of four children, Peter, Susan, Edmund and Lucy who discover a world they would have never thought possible. It's World War II and these siblings are sent away for safe keeping into the English countryside to stay with a delightful old professor until danger subsides at their home in



London. But after an unexpected discovery in the back of a coat closet, Lucy introduces her brothers and sister to a realm of make-believe that is more fun than any fantasy and more real than life and death. It is a world that provides friends and enemies, battles and betrayals, family unity and sacrifice, and a promise to become a king or queen.

Questions: Parents often tell their children to not talk to strangers, did the characters in the book obey this rule? (no, Lucy-fawn, Edmund-White Witch.) Edmunds older brother seems to put him down and not support him. So, what does Edmund do? Was it the right thing to do? What should you do in a similar situation? Who is Aslan? What does this movie say about who God is and how He saves us? What are the things about Aslan we like— make list? How do we know the difference between good and bad (evil)? Psalm 38:20 says, "They repay me evil for good and hate me for standing for the right."

<u>Parent notes:</u> There are some scary and suspenseful scenes and some die(although it is not told to us and there is no blood.) There is a white witch and some magic -like situations. I would not recommend it for children under 7 or 8 years old. If your children like the movie, I recommend reading itor one of the other books in the series, together.

<u>Closing Prayer</u>: Thank You God for this day and this movie that we can enjoy and learn from! Put the message You want me (us) to learn and put it into our heart. May the birth of Jesus be the present and presence of this time. Amen
