

Claiborne is best known for putting his faith into practice with an emphasis on peace—most recently turning swords into plowshares (or guns into farm implements).

He is uncompromising in his beliefs, passionate about his faith, and creative in finding unique ways of capturing the church's attention. Family Promise

Homelessness can happen to anyone. It can be the result of the loss of a job, divorce, mental illness, addiction, large medical bills, an uninhabitable apartment or a variety of other reasons. It is

more prevalent in Indianapolis because Indiana law favors landlords more than any other state. Because of these laws, Indianapolis has one of the highest number of evictions in the country. This is tragic because once a landlord brings an eviction proceeding against a person, that person will have an extremely difficult time finding a landlord who will lease him an apartment.



Family Promise's goal is to assist homeless families in a way that will solve the immediate problem of homelessness and provide a path to self sufficiency. The apartment shelter initiative is the primary program to accomplish that objective. Currently, Family Promise has 20 apartments which it makes available to families for a period of 30-90 days. During that period, families receive a number of services including job counseling, budgeting, help with child care and school enrollment, arrangements for health care including physicals, immunizations, and mental health services. In many cases, if the parents have stable income, they can take over the lease of that apartment after the trial period. Then the family is permitted to keep the furnishings in that apartment. In other cases, the family moves to another location, usually because the parents want to be closer to a job or family. If a family chooses to stay in that Family Promise apartment, then the organization will lease another apartment and place a new family in that apartment.



CUMC supports Family Promise in three ways. First, once a year CUMC solicits household items (other than furniture) to furnish an apartment. Then CUMC volunteers set up an apartment using the donated items. Second, one month a year, CUMC volunteers prepare and

deliver a meal to a family every Thursday. Typically, the volunteers who prepare the meal are not the same as the volunteers who deliver

the meal. This program enables CUMC volunteers to have interaction with the family that we are helping. Finally, CUMC provides financial support to Family Promise from its Missions Fund.

One thing that motivates CUMC volunteers is that Family Promise has a phenomenal success rate: over 80% of families who complete the Family Promise program continue to be independent during the subsequent two years. This is truly life changing for a family that once was homeless.

In May, 2023, CUMC collected over 120 household items from 40 members to furnish a two-bedroom apartment. We filled every shelf in the Missions Closet! In addition, two CUMC families donated furniture to Mustard Seed, to be placed in future apartments. In June, 2023, Carla Bennett used Mission funds to purchase additional items to complete the furnishings list. In July, 2023, six CUMC volunteers loaded the Family Promise van as well as two cars to deliver goods to the apartment. Ron and Jeannine Williams joined the Bennetts to unload the vehicles and set up the apartment. A homeless family moved into the apartment at the end of July.



The laminator is a key resource to not just the preschool staff, but VBS, Children's ministry, and other entities of the church as well! Our teachers prepare crafts, room signs, curriculum and use the laminator to put protective sheeting over those items so that we can reuse them year after year! The laminator will become a much used and appreciated resource for years to come.





The Preschool Director,
Stephanie Holl, approved
the use of \$2,500 from the
Mike Miller Preschool
Endowment Fund to pay
for the expense of a new
laminator. An expense well
worth supporting. The
Mike Miller Fund is a

restricted Endowment fund to be used only to support Preschool needs including Preschool scholarships for ESL children.

Use your IRA to Help Support CUMC!

Many generous ministry partners have seen the benefits of contributing to CUMC from a traditional IRA by utilizing a tool called a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) to support the Church. A QCD always delivers tax benefits, while "regular" charitable donations might not, depending on your tax situation.

A QCD is a direct transfer from your traditional IRA to a qualified charity, like CUMC. At 70½, you may transfer up to \$105,000 annually from your IRA for charitable purposes without adding one penny to your taxable income. Your spouse may also do the same from his or her IRA.

At age 73, the IRS requires you to distribute a certain amount, called the required minimum distribution (RMD), from your IRA whether you need the funds or not. For many IRA account holders, the taxes on this distribution can be a significant burden. But with a QCD, the amount you give may count toward your RMD. If you are required to take income from your retirement account, please consider directing some of that to support CUMC and its various ministries. Two of the benefits include: (1) You don't pay taxes on the QCD distribution and (2) It helps keep your tax bracket, Medicare premium, and costs of Social Security benefits lower.

If you choose to include CUMC's Endowment Fund in your QCD, your gift will make an ongoing difference for years to come. Your connection with the church's ministries and/or missions goes beyond the present and becomes a part of you forever because **your gift works forever**!
