We've had some ups and downs in our search for a new Director of Children and Family Ministries here at Carmel UMC. We've had some promising candidates who just didn't have what we thought was necessary to maintain our excellence and take our ministries to the next level. After months of looking, we are almost back to square one. Now, more than ever, we need your help.

We are looking for someone who loves God, who sees the promise and possibilities of children and their families to be an active, vibrant part of our congregation. Children aren't the future of the church, children are the church—at least a key element of the church—here and now!

We are trying to find someone who is organized, who can recruit and train teachers and ministry teams, and who understands the importance of unleashing the creativity and imagination which is already part of our excellent leaders. (Just look around during VBS and you'll know what I mean.)

Kick off Sermon Series: Something Entirely Different

If all Printed Bibles Were Being Destroyed, What Chapter of Scripture would be Important Enough to Memorize?

Last summer I hosted a summer book club in which we read a variety of books that touched on or influenced our faith. This year I'm recommending only two books: Ken Wilson's Letter To My Congregation (see separate article) and Ray Bradbury's science fiction classic, *Fahrenheit 451*.

451 degrees Fahrenheit is the temperature at which paper burns and this novel is about a dystopian future in which 'firemen' don't go around putting out fires, but where they set fire to any books they find in the possession of their fellow citizens. In this world, it is believed that books are a corrupting influence, and the government is committed to eliminating all reading material as well as punishing the ones who have them. Bradbury was inspired by the Red Scare of the McCarthy era as well as the book burnings in Nazi Germany. In later years, Bradbury was wary of political correctness or any ideological movement that tried to control thought or freedom of speech.

What we are asking you to consider, as you read this novel or think about this kind of future, is a world in which the Bible is banned and all existing copies are being destroyed. If it were up to you to keep a single chapter of scripture alive, by memorizing and passing it on to others, what chapter would it be? In practical terms, which chapter in all of scripture is most precious to you—which chapter guards a portion of God's truth that you believe you and the world can't live without?

We are going to then ask you to submit which chapter you would choose by the first of August and use those chapters as the subject of a series of sermons. Your CUMC preachers will consider your input and then preach on what has made each chapter inspiring and lifechanging. Finally, it's your chance to help craft the sermons from your pastors!

Congregational Care at CUMC & What it Means

Congregational Care is all about fostering a sense of belonging and support within a church family. It is rooted in the teachings of Jesus who in his lifetime reached out to the marginalized, healed the sick and offered solace to those with broken hearts. In CUMC's congregational care ministry, we care about our members' well being by offering hospital visits and pre-surgery calls. Stephen Ministry and Grief Share have been provided to those who struggle with life losses of many kinds. A card ministry directed at those who are of a "certain" age and not as likely to attend worship regularly provides a sense of unity with their church and friends. Other activities that bring support and a sense of belonging, include garments made by our knitters that are given out by the care team. And we can offer a meal to families after a funeral. We invite congregants to send Christmas cards to a list of "Golden Oldies", and last year each received a Christmas lantern delivered to their residences.

In recent discussions we have been asking what it means to be a caring congregation that happens to be in the "Heart of Carmel." What role should Carmel UMC play in reaching those who are homebound? Jesus taught we are to honor and care for our elders. With the number of retirement and care facilities in Carmel, what care needs do they have? Thinking about congregational care beyond our walls creates questions of Who, How, Where? Easy answers? Likely not.

It is hard to believe that I have had my heart and hands in congregational care here since 2009. And in 2018 God presented another opportunity to care by engaging with a group of people at Carmel Senior Living, a new retirement community. Their request was for us to lead a Bible study. Although with reluctance, I said OK. It is an understatement to say I was surprised when 12 folks were present. We met 2 x a month

for 1.75 hours and did that until COVID made us stop. Now active again, I meet with many of the same people, averaging 12-15 per class. They are my amazing "Super Seniors." Two are CUMC members, but the rest represent other faith journeys, and this is one way we learn from each other. We read and study, of course, but it is through the events of life that we care, cry, pray, comfort and love each other. Oh, we also have a ton of fun. I want you to also know that Pastor Tim and Pastor Jessica are leading a monthly study group at the Barrington. In these ways, we are already reaching beyond the walls of Carmel UMC!

About 2 years ago, The Restoracy, our neighbor to the east, asked if we would provide pastoral care to some of their residents. This is not a study, but one day each month, I visit those who have requested a meeting. We chat and laugh, share concerns and pray and end our time with communion. Those little cups come in handy! Although not likely to ever be in church, we can still be church for them. A side benefit, I have new friends! Should we and how can we foster a deeper community of care at Carmel UMC? What does that look like? Are there

resources of money and people to make ideas become reality? Will it make a difference to our community and our church? The answer for me has been and is YES! I have been changed by God's Spirit and call and just perhaps God has changed those we care for, too.


Pastor Tim To Lead Book/Bible Study Ken Wilson's A Letter to My Congregation

Ken Wilson, a Vineyard pastor from Ann Arbor Michigan, has written a thoughtful book about how the church can find its way toward a more inclusive approach to our LGBTQ+ brothers and sisters. He describes his struggles and the struggles of his congregation in light of the scriptures and his role as a pastor. It's a very insightful and balanced discussion of a controversial and sometimes contentious question that our larger United Methodist denomination has wrestled with for many years. Pastor Wilson delves rather comprehensively into the Bible in this book, but no Bible knowledge is necessary to attend.

Pastor Tim will be hosting an evening discussion at 6:30 p.m. and a daytime discussion at 10 a.m. on July 10. If we feel so led, we can schedule addition discussion sessions at that time.


