# The Best Kind of Gifts

Christmas has become a time of gift giving (and, of course, receiving). We spend quite a bit of time, energy, and money getting just the right gift for all the people who populate our Christmas list. When my children were little I would sometimes get a book of 'coupons.' These were little slips of paper on which they'd written various things they could do for me and Sue. Some I could redeem for a hug, another was an offer to empty the dishwasher or pick up their rooms after only being asked once. I found a few just this week while cleaning out a drawer. I think these might have come a mere 15 years ago. Here are the ones I evidently never cashed in from my daughter:

- Good for any chore needed!
- Good for a clean kitchen table for a week.
- Good for two Sundays without being pestered in service (Abby would sit with me for one of our worship services).
- Good for a meal at McDonald's without me complaining (as long as I don't have to eat anything.) The girl was not a McD's fan.

I am wondering now what the expiration date is on a few of these. She'll be home for Thanksgiving, and I'd love a cleared and clean kitchen throughout the holiday.

It just seems as if the best gifts are the gifts we give of ourselves: gifts that cost us something—the sacrifice of our time, the use of our talents, the personal nature of the gift's creation. The same was true that very first Christmas as well. Each of the major figures in the nativity story gave of

themselves extravagantly in order to welcome the Christ child. From Mary to the Magi, from Joseph to the Shepherds, they each risked a great deal in order to prepare the way for the Prince of Peace.

Our worship theme for this advent is The Five Gifts of Christmas and will look at the unique gifts given by Mary, Joseph, The Magi, and Shepherds. 



Ed King has been teaching 2nd /3rd grade Sunday School for 16 years at CUMC. Some of his first students at CUMC have now graduated from college! This year Matt Jones joins Ed as assistant teacher.

Students in this age group receive rigorous, structured teaching of the Bible and of our Christian faith. Each class begins with lighting a candle to remind us of the presence of the Holy Spirit in our class and in our lives. An empty cross next to the candle reminds us that Jesus died for our sins so that we may have eternal life. Next, a student leads the class in a prayer from our "prayer box." Before a new lesson is started, we always review what we learned in the previous week's lesson.

In this class, 3rd graders receive their new Bibles in September and both age groups are taught how to look up and read together selected scripture associated with the Bible lesson. A variety of games and activities are employed during the year to reinforce key learnings of the weekly Bible lesson, ranging from various word puzzles, Bible "Bingo", the wild and crazy "Hot Potato" game, and situational analysis questions on how Biblical concepts can be applied to the "real world" of a 2nd /3rd grader.

We have continued the "Marble Jar" tradition first started when Mrs. Jane Danner taught 3rd grade class students for many years at CUMC. Students add marbles to the jar each Sunday when they remember to bring their Bibles to class, correctly answer questions about the current lessons or "Bible Trivia", and memorize/recite selected scripture such as The 10 Commandments, 23rd Psalm, John 3:16, etc. Students are promised an end of the year "cupcake party" if they fill up the marble jar, and they always succeed! Our goal is to always have a meaningful and fun learning experience.







# Mission of the Month: CUMC Food Pantry


Wow...it has been an exciting and challenging time at the Food Pantry these past few months. Lots of renovations with a new ramp to protect our volunteers and a new donation closet thanks to the Romeo group. The Food Pantry basement has been cleaned out, mold removed, and a French drain installed. We have some new stronger shelving inside the pantry thanks to the Boy Scouts. We've added a couple of new shelves with additional offerings.

All that hasn't stopped almost 400 guests from shopping at the pantry, serving 1500 – 1600 food insecure neighbors each month!

In this season of Thanksgiving, we are especially thankful for our many volunteers who purchase the food stuffs, stock the shelves, and serve our guests. In any given week, we have over 40 volunteers who show their love of Christ by helping their neighbors.

We are also thankful for our many partners . . .
Fresh Market, Niemann Harvest Market, Panera and Einstein Bagels that donate surplus food . . . Orchard Park Presbyterian Church which donates eggs for almost every guest and other food stuffs . . . CUMC Preschool who just visited the pantry and stocked the shelves with their donations . . . community gardens including our very own food pantry garden which continue to donate homegrown produce even this late in the season . . . Cherry Tree Girl Scout Troop that made special birthday kits for guests....Boy Scout Troop 733 that picked up a food donation for Zonta International and stocked the shelves . . . and so many others.

The CUMC Food Pantry is supported by the Hamilton County community in so many ways. Our hearts overflow as we extend our hands to those in need.

## CUMC Members, Mission Groups and Funds Join Together to Improve and Update the Mission House

Are you aware of the considerable number of changes to the Mission House this year? These improvements are critical to the missions and programs it supports (e.g., Food Pantry). Additionally, the Mission House needs constant upkeep to remain viable. In the past five years, the Food Pantry has served over 82,500 people (including repeats) with this year likely to be over 19,000 persons, - the largest year yet with more guests expected in the future.

The Mission House is a lifeline for everyone it serves, making its upkeep and ongoing improvements essential to ensuring it continues to inspire and transform lives. Here are the recent key improvements:

- Installation of Owens Corning Duration Roof and gutters
- Complete basement cleanout and reorganization for use by multiple missions
- New ramp inside the garage into the main floor providing stability and safety
- Basement waterproofing and French drains
- Removal and treatment for black mold in the basement
- New LED lighting in the garage and basement of the Mission House
- New Mission House area for garage receiving and a donation closet
- Installation of a new keypad for Mission House garage door and the creation of a volunteer door with a keypad.
- Painted the Mission House garage interior and front posts of the Mission House porch
- Purchased an additional refrigerator for "produce" used by the Food Pantry
- Updated electrical wiring to support new refrigerators and future expansion
- Installed shelving in the Food Pantry storage closet for paper and plastic bags
- Installation of stronger/sturdier shelves in the Food Pantry by an Eagle Scout
- Installation of new blinds for several of the Mission House windows
- Removal of the cracked patio and tree causing the problem
- New greenhouse installed

All these improvements could not have been done without the support of the following people: Cindy and David Muse, Dave Coleman, Carl Bruhn, Wayne Lerner, Stephanie Fairfield, Kyle Drew, Jeff Silvius, the Henderson team and many more. Funding came from Rushlight Greatest Needs Endowment Fund (\$8,800), Mission Fund (\$3,000), the ERC Fund (\$21,000) and several church building and Food Pantry accounts and gifts (>\$10,000). Thanks to all these individuals, groups and funds for their time, effort, financial support, and love.


