A Note from Pastor Jessica about Sierra Leone

As you read this article, I am likely in Sierra Leone visiting partner organizations and people with whom you all have built relationships with over the past thirty years. It is amazing to be able to step into your legacy and be welcomed with open arms in a country the size of our home state of Indiana but worlds apart culturally. As you may know, Sierra Leone was torn apart throughout the 1990s by a Civil War. Most people my age saw things none of us should ever see, they lost everything, including their parents, and yet, they are rebuilding with resilience. There is vibrancy and thirst, heartbreak and innovation all together, creating a desire to be truly present and joy-filled with those around you.

When I was last here, in 2023, I was awed by how families work together. How one income can support multiple generations. But I was most impressed by how the missions our church partners with are run by the people of Sierra Leone. Operation Classroom, which funds the Taiama Enterprise Academy, a trade school for young adults who could not afford a secondary education or had to drop out for family circumstances, was asked for by the Sierra Leonians – they just needed help financially.

Today, they have 120 young adults getting a chance at good jobs, to start their own business and/or the possibility to go onto University if they choose. This is huge! It is changing the trajectory of their life, and the lives of their family. It costs \$850 to support a student for the year (books, room, board, education) and you all have supported around twenty students each year for the past several years. So when I look around at these young faces today, I see your love and support for every 1 in 6 kids here.

You know I could go on and take over this whole issue of **The Contact** with my amazement and awe at how our congregation has walked alongside the people here but there is only so much space. Just know that even if you have never been, or will never go to Sierra Leone, your love is here. I get to see it first hand, and I am so ever grateful.

Our team would love your prayers while we are here. If you are feeling brave, write them down and send them to us via email.



MISSIONS PLEDGE MONTH

February is CUMC Missions Pledge Month A History and Personal Perspectives

This year, **FEBRUARY** is **Missions Pledge Month** at CUMC, where 100% of pledged mission money goes directly towards outreach in our local and global communities. Our goal is to raise **\$75,000** in pledges and one-time gifts to continue the outreach we provide in our communities and abroad. All of our mission ministries will benefit from the offering in 2025. Pledge cards will be mailed to congregants in advance of Pledge Sunday (and also available at church).

Our largest outreach in the community is our **Food Pantry and Food Pantry Gardens**, which in previous years has fed over 16,000 people in one year. We are fortunate to have many volunteers who are passionate about quality food and give their time monthly or weekly to this outreach. We are one of the few food pantries that consistently has fresh produce and meats for our guests. We pray with our guests, encourage them and offer hope in difficult times.



Our church also participates with **Soups On**, a feeding ministry for the unhoused, at **Robert's Park UMC** in downtown Indianapolis where every Sunday of the year, approximately 250 guests come to eat and spend time together enjoying a safe and comfortable dining environment. For 5 Sundays per year, CUMC provides meals and shares the love of Christ with our brothers and sisters who would otherwise go without.



Our missions that impact children include **Bags of Hope** that gives dignity and comfort to kids in foster care across Indiana, **Kids Coats** that



provides warm winter coats, and the **Salvation Army Angel Tree Program** which helps families provide Christmas when money is too tight for extras.

Our housing ministries includes **Family Promise** of Indianapolis (formerly known as Interfaith Hospitality Network), which addresses the issue of homelessness holistically, by providing prevention services before

families reach crisis, shelter and case management services when they become homeless, and stabilization programs once they have secured housing to ensure they remain independent.

who are struggling in this former coal mining area of Appalachia by rebuilding and creating healthy living spaces for people who live there.

Internationally, we continue to pour into Sierra

Leone by way of the Carmel Preschool and the Seminary as well as



supplies, scholarships and room & board to students and The Betty Carew Women's Training Center where women



are provided vocational training so they can take care of themselves, their families and community.

Now, a quick history lesson. Missions are a vital part of the ministry at CUMC, but there was a time when the budget for missions was relatively lean compared to today. But that all changed at CUMC in January 1997. Under the leadership of chairman Jon Pavey and inspirational support by assistant pastor Rev. Jack King (himself a former missionary to Korea), the CUMC missions committee initiated their first "second mile giving" program for mission's ministries, which was affectionately known as "Faith Promise" for many years. Financial pledges and giving in the first year were outstanding, allowing CUMC to better support existing missions and rapidly expand outreach to new mission ministries. A new tradition was born!

While no longer called "Faith Promise", the special offering to missions has been in effect every year at CUMC since 1997 and will happen again in 2025. Several million dollars have been raised at CUMC over the past 27 years that have impacted thousands of people in many ways, not only locally but also in other states and nations. Shelter and meals have been provided for the homeless. Local food insecurity is addressed in both Hamilton County and Indianapolis. Clothing and winter coats are provided, as well as Christmas gifts and "Bags of Hope" for local children in need. Newly arrived immigrants have been taught English classes in past years. Prisoners have received Bibles. Natural disaster relief (via UMCOR) has been supported in the USA and around the world. Christian ministries, schools and medical clinics have been supported and expanded in far reaching places like Sierra Leone in West Africa and Guatemala in Central America. Mission trips have allowed hundreds of CUMC members to experience and provide direct "hands on" support and outreach in inner cities and rural areas of the USA, El Salvador, Guatemala, and Sierra Leone (just to name a few). The list goes on and on, and none of it would be possible without the faithful support of CUMC congregation.

On a personal note, I first became involved in missions at CUMC in 1994 with my wife Michelle serving temporarily homeless families in the Interfaith Hospitality Network (now known as Family Promise). One small step of volunteering led to bigger commitments until for several years we served as the IHN volunteer coordinators in the late 1990's for CUMC. While the families staying at CUMC were certainly blessed with the generosity and hospitality of our church, Michelle and I also benefited from our service by meeting many special people and better understanding the different circumstances causing homeless situations. Our faith also grew by leading the ministry, as we relied on God to do things we couldn't have achieved on our own. To me, participating in mission ministry is a "Win/Win" for both our missions recipients (having a need met while experiencing Christian compassion) and for our volunteers who receive a blessing while gaining greater empathy/understanding for those being served.

A 2025 Reminder!

Giving from Your IRA – A Special Opportunity for those 70½ Years and Older

If you are 70½ or older, you can now make gifts directly from your traditional IRA account to CUMC using a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) in two unique ways. <u>An Outright Gift</u> – A transfer directly from your IRA to CUMC (up to \$108,000 per year) without paying federal income tax on the withdrawal. It counts toward your RMD, if one is due. <u>A Life-Income Gift</u> – Choose a one-time \$54,000 option to purchase a life income gift (i.e. Charitable Gift Annuity or Charitable Remainder Trust). The income tax due will be distributed over your lifetime of income payments. The tax-free distribution (up to \$54,000) counts toward your RMD if one is due, generally beginning at age 73.

Why consider this gift?

- Beginning in the year you turn 73, you can use your gift to satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution (RMD).
- You pay no income taxes on the gift. The transfer generates neither taxable income nor a tax deduction, so you benefit even if you do not itemize your charitable deductions.
- Since the gift does not count as income, it can reduce your annual income and decrease the amount of Social Security that is subject to tax.
- For many members, this is a tax-wise way to support the operations and missions of CUMC every year and to give thanks to God for blessings bestowed.

How to Make a Gift from your IRA

Contact your IRA plan administrator and request that a "QCD" be made from your account to Carmel United Methodist Church by either:

- 1. Electronic transfer to Horizon Bank ABA # 071201320 Account # 10030141
- Mail check from your IRA to: Carmel United Methodist Church 621 S Range Line Rd Carmel, IN 46032

Your IRA funds will be directly transferred to CUMC. Please contact us to confirm receipt of your gift. You can specify your gift to the Endowment Fund as for either (a) the areas of Greatest Needs (undesignated) or (b) to one or more of the 12 existing designated funds. We encourage you to consult with your legal, tax and/or financial advisors regarding your eligibility to make a QCD and that it meets your particular circumstances.
