A Note from Pastor Tim Burchill

I came across a quote from one of my favorite authors, C.S. Lewis: "Nothing that you have not given away will ever be really yours." I'm working on a sermon about sacrifice and this quote just stayed lodged in my brain. You can't take it with you, is the popular phrase which either means, "spend it if you've got it" or "make the biggest difference you can with what God has entrusted to you." But I'm intrigued with the idea that for something to really be ours we have to give it away.

If we try to hold on tightly to material things there is much in life that will try and wrestle it from our grip, and in the end those things we hold so closely will be left to someone else. If we give to another what we've been blessed with, we get to enjoy the pleasure and joy it gives them here and now as well as knowing that we have fulfilled our calling as good and faithful stewards of God.

There was a successful billionaire
Charles "Chuck" Feeney who was the cofounder of Duty Free Shoppers. At some point
Feeney realized that he didn't so much need 8
billion dollars and made it his great project to
give the money away in order to help others.
This wasn't a radical change since Feeney lived
very modestly—no car, no house of his own, and
he wore a \$10 watch. His philosophy was
captured in his motto: "Giving while living."

Feeney believed in making a difference during his lifetime rather than waiting until death. By the time he officially closed The Atlantic Philanthropies in 2020, he had achieved his goal of giving away his entire fortune. And he had a ball doing it.

As we move toward making commitments to our Capital Campaign these are the ideas that are rattling around in my head. If we want to keep something, really have it forever, then we have to give away.

We give it away with love. We give it away out of gratitude for what we've received. We give it away because generosity is part of the image of God that lies within us. Finally, we give it away because blessing others brings us freedom and joy.

I don't think you can go down this road very long without considering the words of Jesus from Luke 17: "Whoever tries to keep their life will lose it, and whoever loses their life will preserve it." It's a paradoxical teaching, but I think it is about surrender and about finding in God so much more than we could ever provide for ourselves.

I am a proud pastor of a passionate and generous congregation of women and men. Whatever the outcome of our Renovate and Elevate campaign, I know that I am surrounded by folks who love one another and love their church. Honestly, I don't worry that we won't reach our goal. I'm already starting to think of improvements to make with the money that is given above and beyond our campaign goal!





Ever wonder what is above when you are worshiping in the Sanctuary?

Well of course there is the ceiling, the sky and God.

Between the sanctuary ceiling and roof is a very large attic that provides for weather proofing, attic ventilation, down spot lighting, audio/video wiring and insulation.

In the past, Warren (our maintenance saint) and others have had to carefully walk across steel i-beams in a dark attic to replace lights or run new AV wiring or check for roof leaks.



In early May, Carmel United Methodist Church Building Trustees approved use of \$3,297 in operating reserve funds to build a front to back sanctuary board walk. After the main walk was built, 90 degree branching sidewalks were built to service and replace all ceiling mounted lights. In addition, long life LEDs were strung along the board to provide lighting.

As a result of this investment in reducing deadly fall risk, the church will see lower costs for installing new sanctuary ceiling lights, running A/V wiring and increasing insulation in attic to R-49 (a higher insulation value).





New A/I System Installed at CUMC's Preschool Door #6!

Stephanie Holl, Director of the CUMC Preschool, and her dedicated staff are excited to announce the installation of a new A/I Door Phone (video intercom station) at Door #6. This important security upgrade, costing \$4,207, enhances the safety of the Preschool wing and mirrors the existing system at Door #3 (entrance to the Gathering Space).

The new system provides clear visual and audio communication with all visitors during preschool hours, ensuring a safer environment for our children, families, and staff.

This upgrade was made possible through the generous support of the **Ruth Lindsey Preschool Endowment Fund**, named in honor of Ruth Lindsey, the Preschool's first Director. Established over 20 years ago, this fund continues to play a vital role in supporting the Preschool's mission.

The Preschool staff extend their heartfelt thanks to all who have contributed to the Ruth Lindsey Fund. Your generosity has had a direct and meaningful impact—thank you for helping to keep our children safe and our community strong.
