By now you've heard that our ***Elevate and Renovate Capital Campaign*** was a near miraculous success. We had over 140 families make commitments to achieve ***a total of 2.3 million dollars!*** Your gratitude has translated into exciting generosity, and that generosity will allow us to do two things:

1. To add back in to our priorities other renovations and improvements that we could not fit into our \$1.6 million limit. There are a variety of needed improvements that would enhance our ministries. By raising money beyond our goal, we now have the opportunity to tackle even more.
2. Even though the campaign goes on over the next *three years*, it is our hope that we will be able to deal with maintenance and renovation issues considerably longer than that. Getting our facilities and grounds back up to snuff will take some time, and your gifts will give us all the time we need.

For those who haven't yet had a chance to join this vital movement of the spirit here at Carmel UMC, we'd love nothing more than to include your pledge or your gift alongside our own. You still have a chance to get in on the ground floor of something that will be talked about for years to come (at least *I'll* be talking about it.)







Lebanon Children's Home Tour

For years our United Women in Faith have supported the United Methodist Lebanon Children's Home, a home for children in the foster care system just thirty-five minutes from our church. This home has evolved since its humble beginnings, over one hundred years ago, from an orphanage for all ages to a group home for teenagers.

On Tuesday, June 10, the Ruth Anna Circle took eighteen women to tour the facility. It was amazing. The campus has its own school tailored to meet the needs of the kids. State of the art group homes with twenty-four hour care. Counselors who specialize in trauma care are on site and work one on one with the children. They teach life skills and help launch the kids into adulthood once they age out of the foster system.

The Lebanon Children's Home has space for forty-two children and are most often at capacity. The teenagers have lived on average in thirteen foster homes after being removed from their own homes. Many have struggles with substance abuse. Eighty-five percent have experienced some kind of sexual abuse.

It was a humbling experience to learn so much from this UMC outreach and a joy to work together to serve those who need it most.





Our next meeting will be Tuesday, September 9 at 10:00am in the church's Gathering Place.



The first question Pastor Jessica asked me in my first interview was “how do you feel about going on our mission trip to Charlotte in June?” I was enthusiastic about the mission trip, but there was no way for me to know that what we saw in Charlotte would inspire what we will build in our youth group.

In Charlotte, our team of twelve served a well connected web of agencies, dedicated to helping provide local residents with support. The non-profit organizations we volunteered with focused on providing housing, furniture, items for mothers living in poverty, and more. As we listened to each agency share about its mission, they spoke of their interconnectedness, how each agency provided information to each other so that each organization could meet the needs in their specialized area.

On the mission trip, at VBS, on Sunday mornings, I worked intentionally to connect and invite. It all led to our summer kickoff on June 18. More than 20 youth attended the murder mystery kickoff, and throughout the month of July, we'll continue to gather on **Wednesday nights** where we'll invest in friendships, worship God, and move towards a fall kickoff and Retreat where God will show up and show in the ways that only God can.

Congregational Care at CUMC

Recently I had the privilege of meeting with our Congregational Care Team. They are a group of people who wonderfully serve our CUMC family by offering support and care in truly meaningful ways. I thought sharing with you might provide an interesting and helpful insight into this ministry.

So, what is Congregational Care? First it is intentional, addresses diverse needs, involves participation by lay people and fosters a sense of belonging and connection among care givers and receivers. At CUMC it is a ministry focused on meeting the spiritual, emotional and practical needs of those who are active attenders as well as those who can no longer physically join us in worship.

In Galatians 6:2 we find the “why”, “Carry each other’s burdens.” Ephesians 2:10 adds, “For we are God’s workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works”. So, our marching orders come from God, and in doing so we fulfill the teachings of Christ.

If you have an upcoming surgery or in-patient hospital or rehab stay and would like a member of our pastoral team to come visit and offer prayerful support, please contact the church’s main office at 317-844-7275. You can leave your name and phone number, and someone will return your call to get more details.

The following are just some of the ways we extend care to our CUMC family:

- Visitation by a pastoral team member prior to surgery as well as for those hospitalized.
- Individuals in rehab following hospitalization are visited.
- Calls to residents at a facility to offer personal visits, communion and prayer.
- A bible study occurs twice a month at a local senior living facility.
- Handmade Christmas gifts are delivered to individuals on our Golden Oldies list.
- Senior living facility residents participate in mission outreach activities.
- Birthday and seasonal cards are sent to our Golden Oldies throughout the year.
- Handmade cards are sent for special situations in our church family.
- Lap blankets are knitted and made available for individuals.

Your Board of Trustees are deeply thankful and appreciative to our church community for your commitments to the ***Renovate & Elevate*** Capital Campaign. We are overwhelmed by your generosity!

We have been working behind the scenes with church staff and our Finance Committee to be good stewards of the funds that you plan to entrust us, and to prepare for the future.

The Trustees expect to receive the first assessment this month from its Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC) engineer, which is funded through a matching Lilly Center for Congregations grant. The report will inform next steps and decisions for high-priority heating and cooling needs, such as our Sanctuary and Family Life Center gym.

Meanwhile, work progresses on the roof project for our North Wing, over the administrative offices and our Gathering Place. The first phase of gutters and shingled roof occurred in May, and the next step is expected to begin in mid-to-late July. It will involve replacing the skylights that bring natural light into the Sanctuary and Gathering Place.
