

Mid-Year Summary for the Food Pantry

The half-year mark has passed.... time for a Food Pantry update!

Surprisingly, the *number of guests* visiting the food pantry has decreased this year by 6%. We are serving an average of 352 guests per month. Including family members, we are feeding over 1400 Hamilton County residents monthly.

We have received over \$100,000 in donations and grants through June. Expenses total close to \$92,000. We are positioned well to deal with increasing food prices, as well as the likelihood of guests increasing as federal programs become more restrictive.

Over 120 CUMC members and nonmembers have **volunteered** at the Food Pantry this year. Volunteers assist guests as they shop through the pantry, purchase food for the pantry, and "rescue" food from partners such as Panera Bread and Neiman's Harvest Market every week.

Moments of joy and success abound.....

A volunteer reports that we provide a space for folks to just get away from things they are struggling with. In June, a guest came in and she was teary-eyed. She poured out her struggles financially and emotionally--has an adult special needs son. The next week, the guest stopped by just to drop off paper and plastic bags and she had a big smile when she saw us. The volunteer is convinced we provide a respite while also providing food.

Another volunteer reports that a couple of Saturdays ago, he was talking with one of our regular guests. She was telling him how much she appreciates our Food Pantry. The woman works two jobs making \$10/hour and \$12/hour, and the food that she receives each month helps her get by. She also told the volunteer how much she appreciates being able to select her food and how kind everyone is. She went on to tell him that our Food Pantry is helping so many people she knows get by and that it is a true blessing.

Never doubt that your generosity and spirit-filled hearts make a difference to many who are in need.

located downtown Indy right off the bustling street of Mass Ave at Robert's Park UMC. You may have walked past the bench with homeless Jesus statue while going to an event, or dinner on Mass Ave. That is Roberts Park UMC. This year we will be serving on **Sunday September 14 and Sunday November 9.**



You don't need special training to make a difference. All you need is a willing heart. Here are a few ways you can be part of our Soup's On efforts:

HVAC Engineer Assesses Heating and Cooling Needs

The Trustees have received a final high-level assessment report from its Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning (HVAC) engineer. It was funded through a Lilly Endowment Center for Congregations matching grant, which was awarded earlier this year.

The report underscores the needs identified in the *Renovate & Elevate* Capital Campaign. Of the 40 systems assessed, 28 are past their expected life. The cost to fully replace these systems is estimated at \$1-1.2 million.

But there is good news in the report, too. There are opportunities to consolidate air handlers that share mechanical rooms, reduce the number of pumps that circulate hot water from the boiler, and have both be variable volume so they can run more efficiently.

We are already in the process of replacing a Trane air conditioning unit that serves our second floor, which failed in June and could not be repaired. Along with the ducted AC/ heat pump that's part of the Rec Room renovation, we're also looking at opportunities to add more conditioned fresh air into our ventilation systems.

The next steps are to address priority comfort and inconvenience issues with our Sanctuary, Family Life Center, administrative offices and whole-building heat. It will start with an HVAC engineer selecting the correct equipment and designing construction plans for bid. This includes replacing the 1967 boiler in our basement, installing new thermostats and controls for our larger systems, and insulating ducts in the FLC to prevent condensation during the summer.

Carpeting Installed in "New" Sunday School Classroom LL-11

CUMC is blessed with a large incoming class of 2nd graders (8–9-year-olds) beginning in August. The problem is that there is not an <u>available</u> classroom large enough to accommodate 20 kids. It is particularly important to find a suitable room as this is the year the children receive Bibles! Their lessons are less play based and more learning to use their Bibles, memorizing scripture and using age-appropriate games to learn. In this case, room environment matters!

Shaina Murphy, Director of Children's Ministries, has found a room on the lower level (LL-11) that would be large enough for a Sunday School class of 20. It was previously used as storage and is not yet suitable for being used as a classroom. It will need appropriately sized chairs and tables for 2nd/3rd graders which Shaina has identified, and the painting needed will be done by volunteers with appropriate paint that we already own. But... the carpeting needs to be replaced. (It's now two different carpet pieces and colors laid together.) In addition, this room is "out of the scope" of the *Renovate and Elevate Capital Campaign*, but it is an immediate need. Quotes for carpeting to match the new carpeting in other parts of the lower level were requested. With some negotiation, a discounted price for new carpeting and installation is \$1,800.

Children's Ministries has requested that the Endowment Committee consider supporting this need. The Endowment Committee approved the use of the **Rushlight Greatest Needs Endowment Fund** to pay for the carpeting expense. The Rushlight Greatest Needs fund is an unrestricted account in the Endowment Fund to be used for areas of significant need. CUMC extends their heartfelt thanks to all who have contributed to the Rushlight Greatest Needs Fund.
